I. CONSTRUCTION GRANT APPLICATIONS

P. Ritter reviewed the grant applications and his recommendations. He noted that he gave Stephentown and Brunswick top priority in the \$14 million grant because when their projects are completed they should be in compliance with the State Minimum Standards and would no longer have to submit Variance Requests. He reviewed the grant evaluation criteria and pointed out that "routine maintenance" is not fundable.

In the \$14 million grant category, consensus to recommend to the Board the following funding (\$441,390 available to UHLS):
