'NR' prefix defines item as non request. 'PER', 'ILL', 'REF' are all non request, and 'ILL' is always non renewable.

'S' suffix defines an itype with an exception (Special) beyond the loan period designation. I do not want to use the letter 'E' or 'X' for exception because it might make people think they have a specific number of exceptions for a loan period. Special gives a library more flexibility in how they may want to use the itype.

{Create additional Specials based on libraries' need for additional itypes. Libraries will be allowed to request these if they need them. For example: NR7DayS1, NR7DayS2, NR7DayS3, etc. NR7DayS1 can be for those items that have \$1.00 fine rate, NR7Day2, can be for those that are not renewable. Each increment of one denotes any policy exception beyond the loan period of the itype.}
